#### COURSE OBJECTIVE

- (e) Currently only 60 Indian airports can be classed as capable of handling commercial air passenger and cargo services.
- (f) There are currently 24 major international passenger and cargo airports, and 36 regional airports.
- (g) Millions of passengers and thousands of lonnes of cargo pass through airlines and airports each year. All these passengers demand quality customer service, apart from smooth, timely operations.
- (h) Managing a large number of passengers, employees and operations is what aviation management is all about. People in senior management positions take decisions affecting millions of dollars worth of investments around the world.
- A career in aviation management offers opportunities to travel, meet new people and gain new experiences in all parts of the world.
- India's target is to more than double the number of major international and regional hubs within next 12 years.

- 80% attendance is mandatory to appear for Examination or else he/she will be retained in the same semester
  and additional semester fee should be paid in such cases.
- parents / Guardian are advised to enquire about the progress of their ward periodically.
- Fee of any kind once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
- Premature withdrawal from the courses will be permitted only after payment of fees for the entire course.
- Allotment of streams is subject to availability of seats in different streams / category and the percentage in the
  qualifying examination as decided by the management.
- Management reserve the right of admission to any of the courses / streams.
- · The admission once made in final & cannot be changed.
- The rules & regulations are subject to revision (where ever & when ever necessary)
- . The Students/ Parents/ Guardian are liable to follow such changes from time to time.
- · The students should attend all the theory & practical classes regularly.
- Candidates failing in one semester may be allowed to reappear along with next semester examination.
   However, the candidate shall not be admitted to third semester without passing the first semester. Similarly, he/she will not be admitted to fourth & fifth semester without passing second & third semester examinations respectively.
- Its is mandatory to strictly adhere to the prescribed dress code. Disciplinary action will be taken against the students found causing damage to the institute's property and the cost of damages will be recovered from them individually/ collectively in addition to penalty as decided by the management.
- Ragging in any king any form is totally banned and anyone found guilty of ragging or abetting is liable to be
  punished as per the Supreme Court order. The students and parents should furnish a written undertaking to
